•higher amounts of the hormone testosterone




Female bodies usually have




People who are women are usually born with female private parts. This is called being assigned female at birth.

This is called being assigned male at birth.








Some people who are **assigned male at birth** are **women.**




Some people who are **assigned female at birth** are **men.**





LGBTIQA+ Words

Queer


Another word used to talk about the LGBTIQA+ community.

- trying to work out their sexuality or gender.




Asexual
